Commissioner Mathews moved to adopt a proposed resolution regarding the matter. Commissioner Sloniewsky seconded the motion, which was voted on and passed (VOTES: 6-0-0). The resolution reads as follows:

ANC 2E protests Caspian Crust’s application for a new Retailer’s Class “C” Restaurant at 1218 31st Street NW (ABCA-132387) based on the adverse impact on the real property values, peace, order, and quiet of the neighborhood.

The ANC agrees to drop the protest if and when an acceptable settlement agreement is signed by the applicant and ANC 2E. ANC 2E authorizes Commissioner Topher Mathews to sign the settlement agreement with the applicant. The ANC also authorizes Anna Noakes, the ANC’s Executive Director, to represent the ANC at all related hearings regarding the application

The ANC has no objection to the issuance of a stipulated license during the public comment period.

Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis Board Continued – 8:11 pm

Application by Two Nine for a new Retailer’s Class “C” Restaurant at 1218 31st Street NW (ABCA-132387) (2E05)- 8:11 pm

Commissioner Lindner moved to adopt a proposed resolution regarding the matter. Commissioner Lohse seconded the motion, which was voted on and passed (VOTES: 6-0-0). The resolution reads as follows:

Two Nine has already proved to be a great addition to the neighborhood, and since April 2025 it has been operating under an ABCA stipulated license ABCA # 132387. ANC 2E protests this Application based on the adverse impact on the real property values, peace, order, and quiet of the neighborhood. ANC 2E will drop the protest when an acceptable Settlement Agreement is signed by the Applicant and ANC 2E. Meanwhile, ANC 2E continues its support of the Stipulated License. If no Settlement Agreement is reached, 2E will request the revoking of the Stipulated License at the end of the protest period.

ANC 2E authorizes Commissioner Lindner to sign the Settlement Agreement with the applicant. The ANC also authorizes Anna Noakes, the ANC’s Executive Director, to represent the ANC at all related hearings regarding the application.

Consideration of a Resolution Regarding a Request from Tony and Joe's and Nick's Riverside Grill to Allow for the Transport of Alcohol from and to the Establishments on New Year’s Eve (ABRA-017308) (ABRA- 010762) (ANC 2E05)- 8:16 pm

Commissioner Lindner moved to adopt a proposed resolution regarding the matter. Commissioner Maysak seconded the motion, which was voted on and passed (VOTES: 7-0-0). The resolution reads as follows:

ANC 2E is in receipt of the request from Tony and Joe’s Restaurant (ABRA-010762) and Nick’s Riverside Grill (ABRA-017308) to allow for the transport of alcohol to and from the establishments on New Year’s Eve.

As in years past, ANC 2E as a Commission is in full support of this request. ANC 2E endorses the one-day exception for Tony and Joe’s and Nick’s Riverside Grill for New Years Eve. This includes allowing patrons to take their alcoholic beverages from Tony and Joe’s to Nick’s Riverside Grill and vice versa. The areas are joined with tents and appear as one large establishment.

Resolution Regarding Parking Sign Changes Around Washington International School- 8:45 pm

Commissioner Putta moved to adopt a proposed resolution regarding the matter. Commissioner Maysak seconded the motion, which was voted on and passed (VOTES: 7-0-0). The resolution reads:

ANC 2E requests that DDOT change the parking rules on two blocks of Burleith bordering the Washington International School Campus to match the rest of the neighborhood, i.e. 2-hour parking from 7:00 AM -8:30 PM except for Zone 2 permit holders.

The two blocks are:

(1) The East Side of the 1600 block of 37th Street NW adjacent to the Washington International School Campus, i.e. the east side of 37th between Reservoir and R; and

(2) The South Side of the 3600 block of R Street NW adjacent to the Washington International School Campus, i.e. the south side of R street NW between 36th Street NW and 37th Street NW.

Right now, these two sides of their respective blocks are zone 2 permits allowing Non-Zone 2 parking for more than 4 hours only from **4:00 PM** - 8:30 PM.

Commissioner Lohse moved to adopt a proposed resolution regarding the matter. Commissioner Maysak seconded the motion, which was voted on and passed (VOTES: 7-0-0). The resolution reads:

ANC 2E is pleased to receive a very clear draft set of OGB Design Guidelines for Outdoor Dining Facilities (Streateries). In 2020, streateries were introduced into our streetscape during COVID as a temporary measure. Given ongoing community support, in 2025, streateries in the Federal historic district will be expected to follow both permanent OGB and District guidelines.

ANC 2E has the following comments on the proposed OGB guidelines:

1. *Conformance*: The number and location of streateries will change over time.
 - Request: Clarify that OGB will apply the Design Guidelines comprehensively to all applications, with exceptions being rare and justified by exemplary designs.
2. *Barriers vs Planters*: ANC 2E appreciates that streateries currently need to be modular given that restaurants open/close, roadway needs evolve, and design/funding for a permanent hardscape is TBD. Therefore, ANC 2E is pleased that OGB listed planters as an alternative to Jersey Barriers. Planters used at religious facilities in our historic district provide the same level of safety as Jersey Barriers per DDOT, plus a range of planter styles serve offer security in Federal and city buildings across the District.
 - Request: State that OGB encourages more use of well-maintained planters – that meet city safety standards – rather than use of Jersey Barriers.
3. *Applications and Next Steps*: ANC 2E understands the OGB guidelines will work in sync with District guidelines and associated regulations that address areas such as ADA compliance. After multiple delays, the District guidelines and regulations remain temporary. Clear OGB Guidelines, paired with clear District regulations/guidelines, will allow streateries to flourish in our Federal historic district while other community expectations are also maintained.
 - Request: Clarify that OGB will periodically reevaluate its Guidelines as different design elements and hardscape options are proposed under D.C. regulations, understanding that any such modifications must be compatible with the historic fabric and character of Georgetown.
 - Request: OGB will request that the District guidelines reference that OGB Design Guidelines; District regulations already recognize OGB's role. This cross-reference of OGB Design Guidelines will help guide Applicants applying for streateries in the Federal historic district.

ANC 2E stands ready to discuss the above with OGB.
