Resolution regarding the Marine Corps Marathon on Sunday, October 25, 2026- 8:06 pm

Commissioner Lindner moved to adopt a proposed resolution regarding the matter. Commissioner Mathews seconded the motion, which was voted on and passed (VOTES: 7-0-0). The resolution reads as follows:

ANC 2E is once again happy to welcome The Marine Corps Marathon to the streets of Georgetown. This marathon will be its 51st race and will be held on Sunday, October 25, 2026. They are expecting over 30,000 participants on race day.

Like in years past, we expect this to be a well-organized and problem-free event. Coordination with the Marine Corps Marathon Organization (MCM), the Metropolitan Police Department (MPD) and the National Park Service (NPS) is paramount.

The race will enter Georgetown from Key Bridge (at approximately mile 4.75), travel down M Street to Wisconsin Avenue, down toward K Street and then exit onto Rock Creek Park.

Georgetown will see runners between 7:30 – 10:30 am. It is expected that streets will re-open by 11:00 am.

ANC expects that no amplified music/announcements begin more than 30 minutes prior to the first participants and that while roads are closed first responders will be given access as needed in case of emergency. ANC 2E supports this very popular and spirited event. We look forward to assisting as needed.

Resolution regarding Rose Park Farmers Market- 8:11 pm

Commissioner Lohse moved to adopt a proposed resolution regarding the matter. Commissioner Mathews seconded the motion, which was voted on and passed (VOTES: 7-0-0). The resolution reads as follows:

ANC 2E supports the Friends of Rose Park's application to stage the 2026 Rose Park Farmers Market in Rose Park, located at 2609 Dumbarton Street NW, every Wednesday from May 6, 2026 to October 28, 2026 from 3pm-7pm, plus on Saturday December 12th when Santa will visit the Farmers Market. The market serves as a wonderful community-based gathering spot, while also providing residents with a place to shop for locally grown produce, buy pre-prepared food, purchase items from small local businesses, and enjoy special events like holiday celebrations and pup parades. ANC 2E fully supports this fantastic community building effort.

Commissioner Lohse moved to adopt a proposed resolution regarding the matter. Commissioner Mathews seconded the motion, which was voted on and passed (VOTES: 7-0-0). The resolution reads as follows:

ANC 2E is happy to see that the owner of this building is moving forward with what should be an exciting addition to M Street. Currently this location does have a liquor license, but the plan is to divide this property into two. The "ask" is for a license to operate a separate establishment on the second floor. Thus, there will ultimately be two licenses at this address for 2 stand-alone businesses.

At this time ANC 2E protests this request for a license based on neighborhood disruption of peace order and quiet. ANC 2E looks forward to working with the applicant to address these

concerns and will together write and agree upon a Settlement Agreement that will satisfy all worry.

ANC 2E is pleased to offer full support for the Historic Landmark Designation of the Doris Fleeson House at 3344 P St NW. We think this home is both an attractive structure of architectural history but also amazed with Doris Fleeson's great work for reporting, advocacy for women's rights and American history.

Commissioner Mathews moved to adopt a proposed resolution regarding the matter. Commissioner Lohse seconded the motion, which was voted on and passed (VOTES: 5-0-1). The resolution reads as follows:

With regards to 3216 Volta Place NW, ANC 2E has no position on the roof replacement or gutters, however we would like to direct the attention of the Old Georgetown Board on the large white pipe that was installed on the south facing wall of the home without a permit or any notification to abutting neighbors. Repeated requests from neighbors for the homeowner to reduce the visual impact of the pipe have not been addressed. ANC 2E requests that in reviewing this application that the Old Georgetown Board consider the visual impact of the white pipe and

require the homeowner to take steps to reduce its visual impact such as painting it or taking other steps.
